Over the last few years there have been huge efforts by far too many individuals to mention, to make our **Community Asset Transfer (CAT)** from Aberdeenshire for the Old Schoolhouse a reality. When it concludes (expected May 2019) this will be the largest CAT to date within Aberdeenshire!

Once our 175 year lease for nominal annual rent is in place the charity will have a stable, long-term foundation to house the invaluable services for families living with complex conditions. The CAT is a magnificent step forward for us and provides an ideal platform from which to push forward and flourish. We would like to thank **Aberdeenshire Council**, the **local Councillors**, the **local community**, and our **Trustees** - past and present - for their hard work and support resulting in this wonderful opportunity. The conclusion of the CAT is also testament to the unwavering drive and vision of our co-founders, **Suz Strachan** and **Susan Kay** to provide a centre of excellence for people with multiple support needs.

I continue to be in awe of the efforts of staff and volunteers without whom it would be impossible to provide the recognised, first rate service for which the SensationALL name has become synonymous. The increase in registered individuals and substantial growth in services with the number of sessions increasing considerably year on year is clear evidence of this. This is only possible thanks to the dedication and hard work of the staff and volunteers. All in all, the commitment shown is truly remarkable.

Looking ahead, our next major project is to extend the car park and improve the entrance to the Old Schoolhouse, ensuring safe access for all. In our commitment to the community this project will incorporate an upgrade of the next door play facility which is open to the public. In order to achieve these goals it is paramount that we continue to secure funding and corporate support which is a continuous challenge.

So in conclusion, we are in a positive position but ongoing effort and endeavour will be required to continue to develop and deliver our flagship facility.'



Malcolm's story

10 year old Malcolm has Autism and as a result has limited communication, his family have been regularly attending SensationALL for a number of years to get support. Malcolm's parents have struggled to access suitable activities where they could drop him off and where his sister would be welcomed as a sibling.

SensationALL's Inclusive Social Group provides much needed respite for his parent's whilst Malcolm and his sister socialise and interact with other children.

Malcolm's limited communication is not an issue as staff use picture symbols and visual aids so he can express his likes/dislikes and choices. Malcolm's progress has been significant with his confidence growing and he has gradually begun using more complex language.

Malcolm's mum & dad have noticed improvements in the way he interacts with others, his ability to take turns and his speech. He is also better at playing games and structured activities.

We are committed to offering early intervention for young children. It is our aim to help families with concerns about their child's learning, motor skills, sensory processing, behaviour, communication or general development.

As we know how confusing, stressful and often lengthy the diagnostic process can be our services are designed to support families struggling to access appropriate help and advice.

A formal diagnosis is not required to access SensationALL's services

SUPPORTING TEENAGERS

Our services for teenagers (promoting social skills and self esteem whilst providing community experiences) have gone from strength to strength this year.

Teen SocALLise had an exceptional year with themed sessions, a BBQ, several outings in addition to all the usual activities. We even held joint sessions with the local Dyslexia branch bringing in specialist speakers (as in above photo).

The self development and increased confidence of the teenagers is evident to see and the skills they learn will improve their resilience and tolerance, equipping them for the wider world around them.

Craig's Story

Craig has ADHD and Autism and started attending our Teen SocALLise group when he was 16. Craig had good communication skills however, he tended to withdraw from conversation and rarely initiated contact with staff or peers as he found social situations difficult. His way of coping with social anxiety was to be energetic and loud which at school often led to him being the butt of other's jokes. He also didn't like to share information about himself and struggled to make meaningful friendships.

After attending SociALLise for a while, Craig's tendency towards impulsive behaviour settled down and with the support of staff he became more integrated in activities and even started to share experiences in group discussions. This led to a very productive session on the topic of bullying when the group offered a lot of peer support and respect to each other with Craig making significant contributions.

Over time Craig's confidence and self-esteem have developed and he is now forthcoming in talking about and demonstrating his interests (such as martial arts and card tricks!) which highlights great self development and maturity. He even felt ready to challenge himself by volunteering at some of our groups for younger children and staff have praised his enthusiasm and positive outlook.

Craig now attends a full time, supported course at NESCOL and has even got a part time job in a local shop. He continues to attend SociALLise because as his mum says *"the group is so valuable"* to him.

The future looks bright for Craig!

Monday Mayhem was one of our foundational services and with its successful format of baking/snack making, crafts and music providing great social opportunities for adults with support needs and disabilities it continues to be a staple in our timetable.

Our adult services are continually developing as it is important to us that we adapt to the evolving needs of our beneficiaries.

We are committed to ensuring life-long support for those who need it most and for many of our older attendees their visit to SensationALL is the highlight of their week!

Sensory Stories have become a key part of our Midweek Mayhem sessions in 2018-19 as we re-developed this group to better suit the needs of the adults with more profound needs and limited physical ability levels.

We use a variety of materials to give the individuals different experiences of touch, sight, sound and taste. Our creative team use a theme or story to incorporate the materials into, taking the attendees on a journey through their senses.



MAKING A DIFFERENCE



The last year has been busy for SensationALL with developments in services, our staff and the building. Here are some of our key achievements that have made a positive difference:



SERVICE DEVELOPMENTS

We pride ourselves on being needs led, taking a flexible, responsive approach to our service users. This year we have increased the frequency of children's social groups (for primary ages & teenagers), carried out more 'Tea & Tips' advice consultations, introduce new holiday sessions (listening walk, drumming, music therapy, fairy door making, siblings sessions and puppet shows!). All of which means we have helped more people than ever before.



BUILDING WORK

The community asset transfer with Aberdeenshire Council for the Old Schoolhouse is due to complete in 2019, which will give us the freedom to fully re-develop the building. But in the meantime, we need to undertake essential maintenance.

Thanks to **CATS ML** the main activity room got a new floor and storage units and following a grant from **Cash for Kids** we were able to upgrade the soft play room with new flooring, matting and a bigger ball pool.



TRAINING DELIVERY

This year we have provided training workshops on topics such as Sensory Differences and Autism Awareness to a wide range of organisations and groups including

- Riding for the Disabled, - Aberlour,
- Great Western Preschool, - Carronhill School
- pupils at Westhill Academy.

In addition to our family First Aid training session.

It was also a huge achievement to become a provider of Flexible Learning Pathways for Aberdeenshire Council and the successful deliver specialist, tailored groups to local school children with support needs who are struggling to cope with mainstream schooling. Due to the varied needs of the group a responsive therapy-based approach has been crucial to ensure each pupil benefits from the sessions. Our staff have demonstrated patience, understanding and have been accommodating with challenging behaviour and we are delighted with the positive results.

I struggle to remember life before SensationALL, yet 7 years also feels like the blink of an eye! We have to remember to take time to reflect on what we have achieved in this relatively short time. There have been challenges, but we relish the opportunity to adapt what we do to remain relevant and effective for our families.

This year has perhaps been our biggest period of change, requiring us to creatively adapt to our user's needs and evolve services whilst maintaining high levels of specialist support. The statistics speak for themselves with increases in the number of sessions and service users but our biggest achievement has to be the positive impact we have on our families. Its humbling to hear parents talk about a weight being lifted from their shoulders and confidence levels being boosted. It's knowing that a 73 year old woman with a learning disability will endure a round trip of 80 miles to attend a group. Its watching a youngster who struggles to 'fit in' or cope with school, excel and blossom thanks to our support. Its hearing a reluctant child say "I can't wait to come back!".

I also continue to be amazed by the motivation and creativity of our team, who show no end of empathy and integral professional standards towards beneficiaries. They are what makes our charity truly 'sensationALL'.

But there is so much more we want to do!

Due to a lack of sustainable long-term funding we are currently operating at capacity. Our plans for 2019-20 include, expanding our staff resource & training, developing the service provision to fill gaps in the lifelong support we are strive for. We also plan to create a parent forum to not only assist us with consultations but to facilitate a platform for peer support and networking opportunities for those in similar situations.
